

Attendance/Tardy Policy

EXCUSED ABSENSES

Absences shall be excused for the following reasons only:

- Illness or injury of the student
- Illness, injury or death in the immediate family of the student
- Educational Opportunities which are deemed by the Principal
- Pre-arranged Excused Absences

All others will be considered an Unexcused Absence

TARDY POLICY

Students must be in the classroom when the tardy bell rings. If the student is <u>not</u> in the classroom when the tardy bell rings, the student will be considered tardy to class.

Students are expected to be in their first period class before the 7:20 am bell, which designates the start of the school day.

Students who violate this policy can expect one or more of the following responses:

-Meeting with a Dean

-In-School Suspension

-Work Detail

-Administrative Action

-Lunch Detention

E-Hallpass

What is e-hallpass?

An online system that is used to manage all pass situations.

Ex: bathroom, nurse, front office, student services, counselor, lunch detention, work detail, ISS, teacher

How to use e-hallpass:

Access e-hallpass through Classlink

Create the pass that you need. Your teacher will approve the pass. Once you arrive at your destination or return back to class, the teacher will acknowledge the pass.

Receive notifications:

- -Behavior responses from the deans
- -Guidance appointments to meet with your counselor
- -Afterschool tutoring reminders

Parking Pass/Bus Pass

PARKING PASS

- Students who wish to park their car at the school, must have an OHS Parking Pass.
- Parking Passes are located in the front office; see Mrs. Richards.
- Parking Passes will cost \$40 for the school year. OHS Car Tag must be placed in your car; visible.
- · You must park in the parking spot assigned to you.

BUS PASS

- If you need to ride a bus that is not assigned to you, you must bring a signed note by your parent/guardian explaining why you need to ride a different bus.
- You can turn in the signed note to Mr. Bryant or Mr. Gallman.
 They will confirm with your parent/guardian and will provide the bus pass.
- Bus passes are only to be used on the valid dates that will be listed on the pass.
- Bus passes are approved by the district transportation office and requests <u>must be submitted BEFORE A lunch</u> to be considered.

Dress Code

All students at OHS are expected to adhere to the OHS Dress Code Policy.

TOPS:

Collared polo or button-down shirt

Must be one solid color

Colors - white, navy blue, yellow, royal blue, black

NO DESIGNS, STRIPES, SHEER, etc.

School athletic or club sponsored T-shirts may be worn any day of the week.

College T-shirts are allowed on Tuesdays

BOTTOMS:

Blue or black denim jeans

Black, navy blue, Khaki pants

Shorts/Skirts/Skorts must extend to mid-thigh

Must be worn at the natural waistline (all students)

Absolutely NO:

Leggings, sweatpants, joggers, yoga pants, dresses, gym shorts, trackpants, athletic pants, pajama pants, NO SHOWING OF SKIN while wearing ripped or frayed jeans

SHOES:

Sneakers, flats, boots

Sandals may be worn provided they do not interfere with the safety and welfare of the student and do not interfere with classroom policies (ex. Science, PE, etc.)

NO SLIPPERS

HEADWEAR:

NO hats, hoods, durags, headgear, bandanas, combs, scarves, headwraps, bonnets or any head covering unless approved by the principal. Religious head covering must be accompanied by a parent-signed affidavit.

Only ONE ear bud may be worn at a time

Student I.D.'s must be worn on front where visible at all times

Game day attire is approved by Mr. Bryant prior to the start of the season and will be communicated to players by the coaches

Cell Phone Policy

- Osceola High School has a bring your own device (BYOD) to school policy.
- Cell phones are to be put away during class. It is the student's responsibility to know the rules and procedures the teachers have in their classroom regarding phone usage for instructional purposes.
- At OHS, students are <u>not allowed</u> to talk on the phone or on FaceTime during school hours.
- Bring at your own risk.

Refusal to Surrender to Administration= OSS (2 Days)

Students who violate the dress code and cell phone policies can expect one or more of the following responses:

-Parent notification

-Meeting with a Dean

-Work detail

-Lunch detention

-In-School Suspension

-Administrative Action



PBIS/HERO

"Hero is built for the school heroes. The teachers. The students. Those who inspire greatness. With Hero, track the good with the bad, and reinforce positive behaviors that have the potential to ripple throughout Osceola High School."

Hero is an online tracking system where we are able to monitor a student's behavior history. Every teacher and student at OHS will be using the HERO system. HERO points can be added or deducted depending on the behavior and the behavior response.

WHAT TYPES OF BEHAVIOR WILL BE MONITORED?

Points will be deducted for not showing P.R.I.D.E. while on campus or at a school sponsored event.

Points will be added when you are showing P.R.I.D.E anywhere on campus.

HOW DOES THE POINT SYSTEM WORK?

- Students will receive 5 HERO points weekly if they do not get referred to the deans office (45 per Quarter).
- Teachers can also add HERO points if they see you showing PRIDE in the classroom or around campus.
- HERO points can also be taken away if you are not showing PRIDE in the classroom or on school campus.
- HERO points can be used for the following incentives:
 - Event Awards
 - Automatic Awards
 - Consumer Awards
 - Classroom Awards

WHAT ACTIVITIES CAN I USE THE POINTS FOR?

- HERO Store (Open every Tuesday and Thursday)
- Popcorn
- Cotton Candy
- Candy
- Sodas
- Headphones
- Sports equipment
- Pep Rallies
- Homecoming
- Raffles (Donated items, Kowboy apparel, etc.)
- Grad Bash
- School Supplies
- Movie night
- Prom

The cost for these activities will come out at a later date.

Students if you want to score a lot of HERO points all you have to do is make sure your parents sign up. Show one of the deans that your parents have signed up and points will be added to your account.

LASSO/KIP

LASSO:

- · Dedicated time for remediation or enrichment in ALL of your classes
- Small group work, rotating through stations including a teacher-led station
- Starts on Wednesday Sept. 1 and will occur every Wednesday during the regularly scheduled instructional period

KIP:

- Kowboy Intervention Program (KIP)
 - Receive help with ALL subjects areas
 - · Teachers you know and recognize providing help
 - Snacks provided
 - Bus transportation is available
- After-school tutoring
 - Monday Thursday
 - 2:30 pm 4:30 pm
- Saturday morning tutoring
 - 8:00 am 10:00 am

COVID-19 Guidelines and Expectations

Osceola High School is committed to implementing and following safety protocols established for face-to-face instruction. Students and parents are reminded that a student should have their temperature checked and their symptoms assessed at home before school and SHOULD NOT report to school if they have a fever of 100.4 or higher, a cough, shortness of breath, a loss of taste or smell, or have been in direct contact with someone who has COVID-19.

General Guidelines:

- 1) Continue to encourage healthy habits; frequent hand washing, hand sanitizing, cover cough, etc.
- 2) Social distance as much as possible. All space in classrooms, etc. should be utilized to maximize space in between student stations.
- 3) Face masks are optional. Students should not be required to wear masks. It is not the school staff's responsibility to ensure students wear a mask when a parent wants their child to have face covering. Teachers shall not implement rules in their classroom requiring masks.
- 4) Face masks are required on the school bus.
- 5) Continue disinfection procedures.
- 6) Temperature checks are not required.
- 7) Faculty and other meetings may begin as part of your schedule. Social distancing should be implemented when feasible.
- 8) The health room should continue to have an isolation area.
- 9) Student gatherings are acceptable with social distancing when feasible.
- 10) Visitors and approved volunteers may return to campuses.
- 11) Continue to minimize sharing of items in the classrooms as much as feasible.
- 12) Quarantining procedures will remain in effect.
- 13) Students who are quarantined will utilize Teams or Canvas to access their coursework.
