Phlebotomy is the drawing of blood (as by venipuncture) for transfusion, apheresis, diagnostic testing, or experimental procedures. Students in the Phlebotomy program will learn all the knowledge necessary to be able to successfully draw blood and acquire the hands-on skills needed for this fulfilling career.

Students have the opportunity to graduate with their Phlebotomy CPT (Certified Phlebotomy Technician) license through NHA.
