PROMOTING ACCESS TO AN IB EDUCATION

Per the state of Florida's "Controlled Open Enrollment" (Choice) policy, parents/guardians can apply to send their dependent student to any public/charter school (including IB World Schools) with capacity. By adhering to this policy, the School District of Osceola County (SDOC) and Gateway High School (GWHS) ensure access to an IB education for the broadest possible range of students regardless of school zoning policies.

GWHS collaborates with the district's Department of Educational Choices and Innovation (DECI) to implement the following events that promote the Choice policy and encourage students to attend IB World Schools.

- Choice Fair
 - Annual event in November that showcases educational programs at every public/charter school in the district
- Joint Choice Nights
 - Monthly events in December and January that showcase unique curriculums offered by the DP at Gateway and Celebration High Schools, Osceola School for the Arts, NeoCity Academy STEM School, and Professional and Technical High School (PATHS).
- Freshman Curriculum Night (January)
 - Annual event in January that showcases educational programs available at public high schools.
- DP Curriculum Night (March)
 - o Annual event that showcases DP courses offered at GWHS
- Diploma Programme Interest Meetings
 - Digital and face-to-face monthly events (October-May) that showcase the DP at Gateway High School.

Promoting Access to the Diploma Programme

To encourage students to attempt the full Diploma, each year the DP at GWHS allocates 150 spaces for grade 9 and 150 spaces for grade 10 students who anticipate completing the full DP in grades 11 and 12. This policy promotes educational continuity by allowing students to attend GWHS for four continuous years rather than attending separate schools for 9-10th grades and 11-12th grades.

Promoting Access to IB Courses

To increase all students' access to an IB Education, GWHS allows non-DP students to take one year SL courses including IB Business Management, IB Global Politics, and IB Psychology. Eligible students are notified of their eligibility and invited to attend the DP Curriculum Night in March.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

As the DP is a holistic curriculum that operates outside of the scope of the standard 24-credit diploma, the state of Florida has prescribed additional graduation requirements for DP students.² As a result, DP applicants must be in good academic standing and satisfy the minimum graduation requirements to be admitted to the DP. Accordingly, spots in the DP at GWHS are awarded by merit according to the eligibility criteria with priority consideration given to the following groups³:

- Dependent children of active-duty military personnel
- Students who currently reside within the school district⁴
- Children who have relocated due to a foster care placement
- Children who have relocated due to a court-ordered change in custody

Early Admission for Anticipated Diploma Programme Candidates (Incoming Grade 9 and Grade 10 Students)

To be considered for early admission as an anticipated DP candidate:

- Students must reside within the state of Florida, preferably within Osceola County.
 - As multiple schools within the district are authorized to offer the DP, the School District of
 Osceola County has established "school zones" that assign DP students to an IB World School
 according to proximity. Students who are not "zoned" to attend the DP at GWHS must provide
 their own transportation to and from the school campus.
- Students cannot have a pending suspension or expulsion
- Students must apply by semester 1 of grade 10.
- Students must be able to begin attending GWHS within the first three weeks of their anticipated semester of enrollment.
 - Students who do not enroll in Gateway High School during the first three weeks of their anticipated semester of enrollment semester will have the opportunity to enroll the following semester.
- Students must receive favorable behavioral and academic recommendations from their teachers and guidance counselor.
 - The behavioral profile evaluates a student based on adherence to district and school attendance and behavior policies as well as the characteristics of the IB Learner Profile.
 - The academic profile evaluates a student's grades and test scores to ensure they are on-track to graduate.

Regular Admission for Diploma Programme Candidates⁵

To be considered for admission to the DP:

- students must reside within the state of Florida, preferably within Osceola County.
 - As multiple schools within the district are authorized to offer the DP, the School District of
 Osceola County has established "school zones" that assign DP students to an IB World School
 according to proximity. Students who are not "zoned" to attend the DP at Gateway High School
 must provide their own transportation to and from the school campus.
- students cannot have a pending suspension or expulsion.
- students must complete the application process and enroll in Gateway High School within the first three weeks of the academic school year of grade 11.
 - As the DP curriculum stipulates that students must take a minimum of three Higher Level (HL) courses delivered over two years, it is not possible for students to enroll during semester 2 of grade 11 or at any point during grade 12.
- students must have a minimum 2.25 unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA).
 - o A 2.0 unweighted GPA is required to graduate in the state of Florida.⁶
- students must have at least 2.0 English Language Arts (ELA) credits
 - o English 1
 - o English 2
- students must have at least 1.0 credits in French or Spanish.
 - Students who do not have at least 1.0 credits in French or Spanish must complete French 1 or Spanish 1 during DP year 1 and French 2 or Spanish 2 during the summer between DP year 1 and DP year 2
- students must have at least 1.0 social studies credits.
 - o Advanced Placement (AP) Human Geography, AP World History, and AP US History preferred
- students must have at least 1.0 credit in Biology
- students must have at least 3.0 mathematics credits
 - o Algebra 1
 - Geometry
 - o Algebra 2
- students must receive favorable behavioral and academic recommendations from their teachers and guidance counselor.
 - The behavioral profile evaluates a student based on adherence to district and school attendance and behavior policies as well as the characteristics of the IB Learner Profile.
 - The academic profile evaluates a student's grades and test scores to ensure they are on-track to graduate.

Requirements for Course Candidates

- Students must already attend GWHS either as their zoned school or through the Choice policy.
- Students must be in grade 11 or grade 12.
- Students must receive a counselor's approval.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Early Admission and Regular Diploma Programme Application Process

Regardless of year and semester of entry, all students who intend to participate in the Diploma Programme must complete a Choice Application for the District and all three parts (Student Profile, Teacher Recommendation Form, and Counselor Inventory) of the GWHS Diploma Programme Application.⁷

- 1. Parent/guardian must complete the School District of Osceola County Choice Application
- 2. Student's guidance counselor must complete the Counselor Inventory by providing requested academic (grades and test history), behavior, and attendance data.
- 3. Student's guidance counselor will distribute the Confidential Teacher Worksheet to the student's core academic (ELA, social studies, science, and math) teachers.
- 4. The counselor will then send the Counselor Inventory and Confidential Teacher Worksheet via e-mail, district courier service, or United States Postal Service (USPS) to the DP Coordinator (DPC) at GWHS.
- 5. Applications will be reviewed by the DPC and/or IB Guidance Counselor at GWHS.
- 6. The DPC will electronically notify the district Department of Educational Choices and Innovation (DECI) of a student's application status (accepted, waitlist, or denied).
- 7. The DP Coordinator will notify the parent/guardian and student of a student's application status (accepted, waitlist, or denied) via USPS.
- 8. The parent/guardian of accepted students will notify the DECI and the DPC at GWHS whether their student will accept their spot in the DP.

Course Candidate Application Process

As course candidates must already attend GWHS, they do not have to complete a district Choice application or a DP Candidate application. Students who are interested in taking an SL course as a course candidate simply select the course when completing their schedule preference form. Requests are then approved or denied based upon the previously stated eligibility requirements.
