The School District of Osceola County will be offering Statewide End-of-Course and Grade 10 FAST ELA Retake assessments in July for the following students.

- Students who missed any subject end-of-course exam during the 2025 Spring EOC Administration.
- Students who need to retake an end-of-course or the FAST Grade 10 FAST ELA exam.
- Students concluding virtual school courses that have end-of-course exam requirements.
- Students who were actively enrolled in private school courses that have an associated end-of-course exam during the 2024-25 school year.

School District of Osceola County Students - Actively Enrolled for the 2024-25 School Year

Students/parents should contact the school where they were enrolled at the end of May 2024 for scheduling. If the student was not enrolled at one of the hosting schools, then they may contact one of the neighboring schools listed. Registration availability is not guaranteed when contacting the school after June 19, 2025.

Osceola Resident Students - Attending Private School, Home Education, or Full-Time Virtual Programs

Students/parents are required to submit an online registration form located on the Research, Evaluation and Accountability Department website, <u>http://osceolaschools.net</u>. Online registration should take place six weeks prior to the testing date to ensure all needed documentation is processed. Once processed a confirmation email will be sent to the parent with instructions to contact a school for scheduling.

All participating students will be required present a school - or Florida - issued Photo ID on the date of testing to school staff to verify his/her identity.

<u>Testing Policies</u> – Please be sure to review the following policies and discuss them with your student before testing:

- Electronic Devices—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell
 phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the
 devices are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her
 test will be invalidated.
- Calculator Policy—For Algebra 1 and Geometry EOC assessments, approved calculators may be used. For Biology 1
 EOC, a handheld four-function calculator may be used only if the school provides all students with a handheld fourfunction calculator.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment—All tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking a checkbox beside the statement in the secure browser.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they affirm the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, students may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items, passages, and prompts) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites. Please make sure your student understands this policy prior to testing and remind them that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.
- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) employs Caveon Test Security to analyze student test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Students' tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student leaves campus before completing a test session (e.g., for lunch, an appointment, illness), he or she will not be allowed to return to that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- Testing Accommodations—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL, please contact the school to discuss the testing accommodations that will be provided for your student.
