

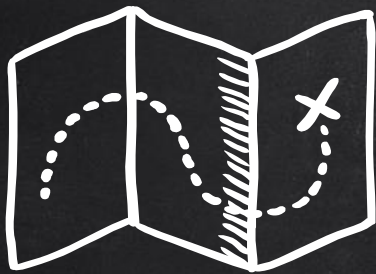


You are a tactile learner with auditory learning traits
