Attendance:

Participants must attend the full workshop and successfully complete all course assignments to be eligible for in-service credit and stipends.

What does "wait list" status mean?

If a roster is full, you may place yourself on a wait list for the course. If a registered participant withdraws prior to the course start date, you may be moved to "registered" status, and you will receive an automated email notification from MyPGS.

Can I just show up at a workshop without registering on MyPGS?

No, pre-registration allows the facilitator to have sufficient materials, guarantees that the participant will have a seat (for some workshops we pay by participant), and an opportunity to earn master in-service points if you attend the entire workshop and complete the requirements. Participants that show up without pre-registering may not have the opportunity to participate.

How do I cancel my registration if I cannot attend a course?

If you cannot attend a course, please withdraw from it by selecting the course under "My Course" in the Professional Development tab and select "withdraw." This option will only be available until the day before the start date of the course. For last-minute withdrawals, please contact the instructor.
