Know Your IX Releases Findings from Student Survivor Survey The findings include statistics and first-person accounts from sexual or dating violence survivors who reported their abuse to their schools.





Know Your IX, a survivor- and youth-led advocacy group that aims to empower students to end sexual and dating violence, released a report drawing from a survey of more than 100 student survivors who reported their abuse to their schools.

The 42-page report discusses adverse impacts of sexual or dating violence experienced by students, including educational, financial, career and health impacts.

SAFETY SHOUT-OUT

A few weeks ago, East Lake Elementary had a minor bus accident with 8 students on board. He was also informed the parents would be contacted by transportation.

Mr. Hennessy felt he needed to contact the parents as well, so he drove to the site of the accident to collect the roster of the students on board. He then drove home and contacted the parents of the students on the bus that evening.
