What is Title I?

- Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- > The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
- The funds are given to the Local Education Agency (LEA), which is the District, to be dispersed to the schools.
- Bellalago Academy is a Title I school because more than 70% of the students meet poverty requirements.







How do we use our Title I funds?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs. At our school we are using Title I funds to:
- Increase student achievement
- Add academic coaches to our staff
- Add paraprofessionals to assist your children
- Purchase classroom materials and supplies
- Provide tutoring
- Offer extra professional development for our teachers
- Purchase software and technology equipment
- Conduct parental Informational
 - meetings/trainings/activities



What is the 1% set-aside and how are parents involved?

The Title 1 Allocation for The School District of Osceola County for 2022-2023 is \$17,873,734.92. The law states we have to set aside 1% for parental involvement.

>90% of the 1% amount must be allocated to all Title I schools in the District to implement school-level parental involvement. Our school received \$ 40,391.00

➤The School District of Osceola County, will use the remaining 10% for family engagement, as well as parent events and training.

- Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) four-week notice
 - Our school presently has 93% of state certified teachers
 - 9 teachers who are teaching "out of field"
 - Information sent home twice a year
