Stephen Covey	Time Wasters: Brainstorm some things that you do that wastes a lot of your time. Sometimes these things are fun and relaxing. If you do them too much, though, they may get in the way of the important things.
Revisit BIG ROCKS you made. Are you prioritizing your BIG ROCKS?	As a family come up with the 3 most important things that should happen every day in your house.	Ask your parents what are the most important BIG ROCKS they have each day?	Make a list of things that are urgent, and you need to do NOW!	Talk about what you want to accomplish as a family this month.
