

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - THE BASICS

- Earn 24 high school credits
 - Pass 1 full year class = 1 high school credit
 - Pass 1 semester class = 0.5 high school credit
- Have a 2.0 GPA or higher
 - Equates to a "C" average
 - GPAs are recalculated at the end of every semester
- Pass the required exams
 - 10th grade FAST ELA PM3 (May)
 - Algebra 1 EOC

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: 24 CREDITS

- English... 4 credits
- Math... 4 credits
 - 1 credit of Algebra 1
 - 1 credit of Geometry
 - 2 "equally rigorous" math

- Science... 3 credits
 - 1 credit of Biology
 - 2 "equally rigorous" science
- Social Studies... 3 credits
 - 1 credit of World History
 - 1 credit of US History
 - 0.5 credit of Government
 - 0.5 credit of Economics

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: 24 CREDITS

- Physical Education... 1 credit
- Performing Arts... 1 credit
- Electives... 8 credit (7.5 for class of 2027 and beyond)
- For class of 2027 and beyond only: 0.5 credit of Personal Financial Literacy

Students are also encouraged to...

- Complete at least 2 credits of the same world language
- Complete community service hours

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - ASSESSMENTS

- Algebra 1 EOC
- 10th grade FAST ELA PM3

Must pass both exams for high school diploma

- Geometry EOC
- Biology EOC
- US History EOC

Will count for 30% of your final grade of the course

• Florida Civic Literacy Exam (FCLE)

Required to take after completing US Government, does not count for final grade of the course

DIPLOMA DESIGNATIONS

Scholar Designation

- Pass all EOCs (Geometry, Biology, US History)
- Pass Algebra 2
- Pass Chemistry/ Physics
- Earn 1 credit of Equally rigorous science
- Earn 1 credit of statistics or equally rigorous math
- Earn 2 credits in same world language
- Earn 1 credit in AP/DE course

Merit Designation

- Earn an industry certificate
- At OCSA, students can take the Adobe certification exam to earn the merit designation

DESIGNATION - SEAL OF BILITERACY

Gold seal of biliteracy

- Complete 4 credits in the same world language with a B average
- Earn a 4 or higher on the 10th grade ELA FAST PM3

OR

- Pass the AP Spanish Exam with a 4 or higher

Silver seal of biliteracy

- Complete 4 credits in the same world language with a B average

OR

- Pass the AP Spanish exam with a 3

AP CAPSTONE CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA

Awarded by College Board

- AP Capstone Certificate
 - Pass the AP Capstone Seminar and AP Capstone Research exams with a "3" or higher
- AP Capstone Diploma
 - Pass the AP Capstone Seminar and AP Capstone Research exams with a "3" or higher AND
 - Pass 4 additional AP exams with a "3" or higher

HOW SCHOOL COUNSELORS CAN SUPPORT YOU

- · Your school counselor will meet with you to discuss the next classes you need
- Discussion will be based on your interests, goals, strengths while pacing you to stay on track for graduation
- Centered around working smarter, not harder
- Students can schedule additional appointments with us

HOW PARENTS CAN SUPPORT

- Understand your child's high school graduation requirements
- Check your child's grades and progress on Focus
- Consult with your child's school counselor

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

DUAL ENROLLMENT

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES (AP)

- AP curriculum, college-level courses
- Students who pass the AP exam will earn college credits
- An opportunity to earn the AP Capstone Certificate or Diploma
- Some 9th graders begin taking an AP class, especially if they were academically accelerated in middle school

DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Students can earn college credits while earning high school credits
- Most students DE at Valencia College
- An opportunity to explore courses not offered at OCSA
- Great way to earn free college credits
- Must have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 upon time of application
- Need passing scores on the PERT (Reading, Writing, Math)

AP VS DE

AP

- Placement based on test history, teacher/counselor recommendation
- AP options are limited at OCSA
- Earn college credits upon passing the AP exam; if students do not pass the AP exam, they can still earn HS credit
- Nationally recognized

DE

- Students must apply for DE and must have qualifying GPA and PERT scores
- Can take elective classes not offered at OCSA
- Earn college and high school credit upon passing the course; will affect GPA
- Regionally recognized; credits may not be accepted outside of Florida

AM I READY FOR ACCELERATED COURSES?

- Great for students who have "maxed out" in their honors level courses
- Independent, responsible, good time management
- Ready to persist through a challenging course

HOW SCHOOL COUNSELORS CAN SUPPORT YOU

- Discuss if you are ready for accelerated courses
- Identify strengths and interests to recommend most appropriate accelerated courses
- Available for check-ins throughout the year to discuss progress on accelerated courses
- We can help keep you balanced!

GRADUATING WITH YOUR AA THROUGH DE

- Students who Dual Enroll may graduate from high school with their Associates in Arts degree
- AA degree = 60 credit hours of college coursework
- Factors to consider when pursuing your AA
 - Declaring a college major immediately after high school graduation
 - Condensing a 4-year experience into 2 years
 - Being a well-rounded student while you are in high school

A NOTE ON EARLY GRADUATION

• Early graduation is when students graduate at least a semester early

- Factors considered into early graduation
 - Your goals and reasons behind your intent to graduate early
 - Emotional maturity, ready to be an adult
 - The opportunities, resources, and experiences you may be missing out on by graduating early



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
