

Level 3 or higher in the 10th grade Reading FAST PM3

Level 3 or higher in the Algebra 1 EOC exam

<u>Completion of Personal Financial Literacy course (Class of 2027 and beyond)</u>

\*Other Important Tests

Geometry, Biology, US History EOC = 30% of overall grade

### Weighted GPA

Honors is .5 point weight

A=4.5 points

B= 3.5 points

C=2.5 points

D=1.5 points

F=0 points

# Weighted GPA AP/IB/DE is 1 point weight

A=5 points

B= 4 points

C=3 points

D=2 points

F=0 points

If you made all C's in every class you took this would give you a 2.0 Unweighted GPA which is what is required for graduation.

# Diploma Designation

### Scholar Designation

- Earn a credit in statistics or equally rigorous course
- Pass Geometry, US History, Biology EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
- Earn 1 credit in equally rigorous science
- Earn 2 credits of world language course
- Earn 1 credit in AP, IB, DE course

# Industry Scholar Designation

- Students can earn the Industry Scholar Designation by taking the Adobe Certification exam
- A student can earn both Scholar and Industry Scholar designation

# Seal of Biliteracy


At OCSA, students will have the opportunity to take Spanish 1, Spanish 2, Spanish 3 Honors, and AP Spanish as an elective.





# AP Capstone Certificate/Diploma

- CollegeBoard Accelerated program
- College level courses and rigor
- Earn college credit by passing test at the end of the year with 3 or higher
- AP Seminar is typically recommended for juniors, and AP Research for seniors.



# Dual Enrollment Opportunities





- Required to meet minimum scores on the PERT
- Online/in-person options
- Some students can graduate high school with their Associates degree

- Open to juniors and seniors only
- Part-time for juniors only
- Career-specific programs
- In-person



- Require college-ready SAT/ACT scores
- O UF is 100% online
- Mostly limited to electives



# Dress Code

- Top: Polo, oxford, or dress shirt (Purple, black, navy blue, white)
  - No see-through materials
  - Please keep buttoned up shirts buttoned
- Bottoms: Jeans, khaki, or dress slacks (Navy blue, black, tan)
  - No holes
  - Appropriate length
  - Sweatpants, leggings, tights not acceptable
- No headwear without administrator approval
- Outerwear: Hoodie/ jacket with school logo, zipped hoodie
- Dance majors must come to school in dress code even if you have dance 1st or 5th period.
- Must wear Student ID

### **OCSA** Requirement

- Students must earn a quarterly grade of 70% (C average) or higher in all classes to stay in good standing at OCSA.
- Students who earn a D or an F at the end of each quarter will be placed on probation, and they must bring their grade up to a C or higher the following quarter.
- Leadership will conduct a review of student's academics, behavior, attendance to determine a student's placement at OCSA.

Drama	\$100 per year
Dance	\$100 due August 30
Technical Theatre	\$50 per year
Vocal	\$100 per year  Ms. Testa is also requesting students to purchase black slacks.
Visual Arts	Ranges from \$30-\$50 per class, may be higher for junior/senior classes
