Federal Student Aid Identification

The FSA ID, which consists of a user-created username and password, replaced the PIN effective May 2015. It allows users to electronically access personal information on Federal Student Aid Web sites as well as electronically sign a FAFSA.

Create your FSA ID and password at:

www.studentaid.gov/fsa-id

Username can only have letters and numbers.

Password cannot include first or last name, SS#, or date of birth.

The password must be between 8 and 30 characters long and all of the following:

- Numbers
- Uppercase letters
- Lowercase letters

In order to create your FSA ID, you must have access to your cell phone and/or your email address. Department of Education will send a secure code to your cell phone and/or email that must be verified in order for the FSA ID to be created.

No one should create a FSA ID for you and you should never share your FSA ID with anyone. Keep this page for your records.

Bright Futures Application/Requirements

- APPLY for the scholarship by submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) in your SENIOR YEAR
- Beginning October 1st of senior year and by no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- Eligibility requirements must be met <u>by high school graduation</u>, but scores of ACT•/SAT•/P.E.R.T. tests taken <u>through June 30</u> are accepted for evaluation purposes.
- Don't use it right away? Re-apply within two years of high school graduation to have your award reinstated.

After submitting the FFAA, the student is responsible for tracking application and award status online and keeping the Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) informed of any demographic or institutional changes.

Renewed automatically each year (up to the scholarship limit) if the student <u>maintains the required GPA</u> and earns the <u>required credit hours</u>. See the Bright Futures Student Handbook for more details.

General Requirements:

- ✓ Be a Florida resident and a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen
- Earn a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent from a Florida public high school or a registered Florida
 Department of Education private high school.
- ✓ Not have been found guilty of, or pled nolo contendere to, a felony charge, unless the student has been granted clemency by the Governor and Cabinet sitting as the Executive Office of Clemency.
- ✓ Be enrolled for at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours (about 2 classes) per term (semester).

'ONLY REQUIREMENT: Must be an Osceola County resident to apply'

ITEMS TO HAVE READY

- Family's annual income range
- GPA weighted and unweighted
- · Highest SAT (super) score and highest ACT (composite) score
- Your class ranking
- Senior portrait photo to upload
- PDF of your transcript from Guidance to include in application
- Name and email address of a teacher, coach, or school admin to request a recommendation
- Number of volunteer hours including location served, amount of hours at each location, duties and responsibilities, and contact information of the person who can verify hours
- List of all activities you participated in at least 20 hours during high school (i.e. sports or clubs) and any leadership position you held
- 250 word statement answering the question:
 "What are your educational/career goals and plans to achieve them?"

FAQS

Do I have to have a certain GPA, SAT/ACT score, volunteer hours to apply? No, the only requirement is you must be an Osceola County resident.

Do I have to complete the FAFSA before I can apply?

Can I start the application today and finish later? Yes, your answers will automatically save.

How will I be notified if I received a scholarship? Via the email address you used to create your account.



When will I know if I did receive a scholarship or did not receive a scholarship?

The awarding process starts in March; however, all students will be notified if they did or did not receive a scholarship by the end of April.

Where will the scholarship funds be sent?

The funds will be sent directly to your college/university. We do not disburse funds directly to students.

After I receive a scholarship, what is my next step to receive my funds?

You must submit a completed disbursement form (located on our website), proof of enrollment, and a thank you note written to the donor of your scholarship.
