Message from the Principal

Dear NCMS Parents/Guardians: It is hard to believe this is my second year as the principal of Narcoossee Middle School (NCMS). In many ways, last year was incredible, as one of our most

significant accomplishments was that we became an A-rated school and the highest-performing middle school in the school district. It was due to the hard work of all our students and staff who persevered throughout the year, which resulted in a strong performance on every standardized test in every grade level.

As we continue to build on last year's successes, I wanted to showcase all the wonderful activities and programs that have thrived and continue to thrive at NCMS. We are still AVID strong, as we have three magnificent teachers who continue to run an incredibly successful program and who are able to use our school for an AVID showcase for the second year in a row. In terms of academic clubs, we still offered VEX, Sphero, Odyssey of the Mind, Battle of the Books, Mathletes, and National Junior Honor Society (NJHS). Additionally, the media center underwent a transformation, as we are trying to make it a place where students can feel connected to literacy daily. One of the ways we do so is by hosting author visits, so students can have first-hand experience with published authors and gain insight into the writing process. Moreover, we are in year two of our PBIS revamp, and I'm happy to say that it is going strong with karaoke, social hours, soccer penalty shootouts, and staff vs. students' games. In addition, the PBIS BEAR store continues to open, and we partnered with PBIS to host our Winter FAST Party, where students earned pizza, a treat, and time with their friends as they listened to music. This year, they had to be on track to meet their learning gains and proficiency compared to last year's PM3 to earn the reward.

At NCMS, we not only focus on academics, but we also are very focus on the arts and sports. We've had two amazing concerts for band, chorus, and orchestra that displayed the musical talents of our Black Bears. Our students have been able to participate in multiple Music Performance Assessments (MPAs), and some of our students were selected for All-County Band, Jazz Band, and Chorus, which is an incredible honor. In athletics, we have remained competitive in all middle school sports with active participation by students in tryouts and by parents during home and away games.

Even though last year was amazing, this year, we remained focused and reflected on the areas we could improve on, as my goal is always to ensure Black Bears can become the best versions of themselves. In the words of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. "If you can't fly then run, if you can't run then walk, if you can't walk then crawl, but whatever you do you have to keep moving forward", and at NCMS we never stop moving.



Attention Parents

Medical Opt-In 2024-2025

Parents, please be aware that the Osceola School District's medical option form has been changed for the 2024-2025 school year. The



new form requires parents to opt-in to any medical services for their children, instead of opting out as in years past. If a parent does not opt in, or does not make a selection, the school nurse will not provide medical services to your child. Only emergency medical services would be permitted.

Parents are asked to please log in to their FOCUS Parent Portal account and complete their medical opt-in/opt-out selection prior to the beginning of school. Besides being a "one-stop shop" for completing necessary educational forms and updating your child's important information, the FOCUS Parent Portal gives parents the opportunity to log in regularly to monitor your child's progress and attendance in school throughout the school year.




Here Comes The Bus is an easy-to-use website and app that enables parents to see the location of their child's school bus on a smartphone, tablet, or personal computer.






