New District Wireless Device Policy:

The School District of Osceola has instituted a no cell phone policy, including tablets, earphones and earbuds, unless specifically permitted by administration for special needs.

NCMS Student Laptop Reminder:

Students are to have their fully charged laptops at school every day with their charger in their laptop case, unless they have special accommodations. It is important to keep them in their appropriate cases with their charges to prevent costly damage that would be imposed on the parent.

The Importance of Student School Supplies:

School supplies, such as backpacks, school laptops, uniforms, textbooks, notebooks, pencils, pens, erasers, calculators and paper are important for students to be prepared and successful at school.

Arriving equipped for the school day:

- Improves grades, creativity, attitudes towards learning, peer relationships and self-image.
- Inspires and motivates, making the experience more positive.
- Impacts participation and attendance, making students more attentive in class.
- Prevents unwarranted behavior, helping students start on the right foot.
- Helps them feel confident and empowered to function in the classrooms.
- Helps classroom instructions to start on time.

Please make sure your child has all the necessary supplies every day. If you are in need of assistance, you may contact your child's school counselor.

Items That Are Not Allowed on School Campus:

- Gum, carbonated drinks, energy drinks, coffee
- Hairspray, cologne, perfume or scented lotions (many students and teachers have allergies and/or asthma which are aggravated by these items)
- Any item in a glass bottle
- Electronic game systems
- Toys, stuffed animals, balloons, etc.
- Fast-food student lunches, cupcakes, cakes or other celebratory foods

Important Information for 7th Grade:

All students entering 7th grade must provide the school with an updated immunization record (FL form 680/white form). All 7th grade students must have (1) Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap) vaccine and all other required vaccines must be up-to-date.


Testing Information
