



8th Grade Dance & Awards Night Information

Dance: Friday May 17th 6pm-8pm

It is a Narcoossee Middle School tradition to host an 8th grade dance at the end of the year. This dance is for 8th grade students of Narcoossee Middle School ONLY.

To be clinible to strend the dance students must meet the following requirements:

To be eligible to attend the dance students must meet the following requirements:

- ➤ Follows Bears Expectations
 - o If you have an Out of School Suspension (OSS) in Q3 or Q4 you are ineligible to attend
 - o If you have excessive In School Suspensions (5) in Q3 or Q4 you are ineligible to attend
- Arrives to class on time regularly
 - If you have excessive tardies (10 or more) in Q3 or Q4 you must be placed on a tardy contract before earning eligibility to attend.
- > Return all library books or pay for lost books
- Attend school on May 17^{tl}
- Administration reserves the right to allow or deny eligibility for any reason

Dance tickets will be on sale for \$5 from May 6th-May 15th before school.

At the dance students are expected to follow all school & district rules. Students that behave inappropriately will be removed from the dance and could have further consequences.


