Step 1: Sign the Dual Enrollment Contract

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
The DE contract must be signed to show that you understand the responsibilities of the Dual Enrollment student. Please read each statement carefully.

<u>Dual Enrollment</u> <u>Contract- Click</u> <u>Here</u>

Steps

- Go to the Valencia Atlas website.
- Click on "Sign Up for an Account".
- Click the checkbox to accept the privacy conditions.
- Complete the requested information, using your VID#.
- Wait approximately five minutes before trying to log into your Atlas Account.

Step 2: Creating your Atlas Account





Steps

- Wait 24-48 hours after you create your Atlas account for your online orientation to show up in your account.
- 2. Log into your Atlas account.
- 3. On the Atlas main page, click the New Student Orientation box on the left side of your Atlas account.
- 4. Click the link "Online" to register for an orientation.
- 5. Your New Student Orientation will be an online orientation.
- 6. Online Orientation takes approximately 30-45 minutes.

Step 3: Complete your online orientation

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Tips:

- You cannot register for your classes until you complete the orientation.
- It may take 48 hours after you complete your orientation for you to be able to register for classes.

Step 4: Register for Classes

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Steps

- 1. Log into your Atlas account.
- 2. Click on the Courses tab.
- 3. Click on Registration (on the right).
- 4. Click on Register for Courses; click Submit.
- 5. Choose which term you are registering for, then click Submit.
- 6. Click Step 3.
- 7. Click Class Search.
- 8. Click Advanced Search.
- 9. Choose a course.
- 10. Choose full term

IMPORTANT: You cannot register for a flex term!

11. Click Search.

Picking the Right Classes

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You can pick up to four courses. Four courses is considered full time, and full time students can choose to take just their art area classes at OCSA. If you take less than four at Valencia then you are considered part time and will need to take one or more classes at OCSA.

DE COURSE REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

Will this class satisfy a high school graduation requirement?

Will your DE class give you a high school academic credit, or an elective credit? It is your responsibility to do your research!

Does this class have the date range of **January-May** for Spring semester or **August-December** for Fall semester?

Counselors will not approve any schedule with a Flex Class.

Is this class online, inperson, or real-time virtual? If it is an inperson/real-time virtual class, can I attend my classes on time?

Tip: If you are taking an inperson or real-time virtual class, consider taking a class in the afternoon after 1:30pm so it is less likely to conflict with your art area classes.

- 4. Click on student detail schedule

For Students with IEP/504

IMPORTANT

After the first week of school, please consult with your school counselor before dropping a course.

Withdrawing from one course will result in a "W" on your college transcript. This can affect financial aid in the future. If you drop from a second course, you will be withdrawn from the dual enrollment program at the end of the semester, and you will not be allowed to take any dual enrollment classes in the future

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FAQ: What are the consequences of dropping a course?

- 1. Click on the Courses tab.
- 2. Click on Registration.
- 3. Click on Register for Courses.
- 4. Click on Step 3: Add/Withdraw.
- 5. Click on the dropdown arrow and choose drop via web.
- 6. Click on Submit Changes.



FAQ: How do I drop a course?

Yes. To apply for the Seneff
Honors College at Valencia
College, log onto Atlas and click
the "Students" tab. In the middle,
"Student Forms" section, click on
"Applications". You also need a
teacher recommendation letter
and write a 500-word essay.



FAQ: Can I take Honors Classes at Valencia College?

FAQ: How many college credits have I earned through my AP classes?

Student ID cards can be obtained in the Security office on any Campus once you have registered and paid for your classes. The first student ID card is free. Replacement fee is \$5 at all campuses except DTC which has a \$15 fee. You will need your student ID card to access campus services such as the Library and Testing Center. Student IDs can be used for library access, testing purposes and discounts in the community.
