- 24 Credits
- 2.0 GPA (unweighted)
- 1 online course completion (0.5 credit)
- Level 3 or higher on the 10th grade Reading FSA
- Level 3 or higher on the Algebra 1 EOC exam

Other Important Testing:

Geometry, Biology, US History EOC = 30% of overall grade!

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must do the following:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra II;
- Pass the Geometry EOC;
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course;
- Pass the Biology I EOC;

•Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics;

- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics;
- Pass the U.S. History EOC;
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language; and
- Earn at least 1 credit in AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course.



In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must do the following:

attain one or more industry certifications

A student may earn both diploma designations





GPA Calculation

Unweighted GPA Points A=4.0 points B= 3.0 points C=2.0 points D=1.0 points F=0 points Weighted GPA Honors is .5 point weight

> A=4.5 points B= 3.5 points C=2.5 points D=1.5 points F=0 points

Weighted GPA AP/IB/DE is 1 point weight A=5 points B= 4 points C=3 points D=2 points F=0 points

If you made all C's in every class you took this would give you a 2.0 Unweighted GPA which is the minimum required for graduation

AVID is a collegereadiness system designed to increase the number of students who enroll in four-year colleges. It has a proven track record in bringing out the best in students, and in closing the achievement gap.

AVID is not just another program... at its heart, AVID is a philosophy. Hold students accountable to the highest standards, provide academic and social support, and they will rise to the challenge.

What is an AP Course?

AP courses are college-level courses of college level rigor offered in high school.

These courses reflect what is taught in the best introductory courses at colleges and universities.

Students take the **AP Exams** at the end of the course to measure their mastery of subject matter at the college level.

A grade of 3 or higher on an AP exam usually allows students to earn college credits and/or placement in advanced courses in college.

What are the Benefits of AP?

Prepares students for college level courses. Students learn rigorous collegelevel skills and content AP courses are interesting and rewarding academic experiences. Taking AP courses and college level exams is valued in the university admission process

Students can earn college credits and / or skip introductory courses at the university, which saves families money and helps students graduate on time.

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
AP Capstone Diploma

- Students can earn an AP Capstone Diploma throughout high school
- Students must take AP Seminar (11th grade) and AP Research (12th grade) and earn a 3 or higher on the AP exam.

Students can earn the AP Capstone Diploma[™] or the AP Seminar and Research Certificate[™].

Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing receive the AP Capstone Diploma[™].

Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research but not on four additional AP Exams receive the AP Seminar and Research Certificate[™].

- Focus on the 4 precepts of Pre AP: Close Observation and Analysis, Evidence Based Writing, Higher Order Questioning, and Academic Conversation


Tips for Students
