Dismissal


- Car rider parents need to have a visible car tag. A visible car tag makes the process of calling students faster. If your car does not have a tag, you must park in the visitors parking and enter the office to sign out your child.
- If you need to pick your child early, it is essential that you please do it before 2:50 PM on (Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri) and 1:50 PM (Wed.) The staff has dismissal duties, and we cannot guarantee that we will be able to assist you until dismissal is over.

General academic guidelines for both Face to face students and digital students

- **Tardiness and attendance** Both face-to-face and distance students will be required to be on time to class. Students must be in their respective classes at the time that corresponds to their homeroom group. Students are expected to attend classes on time to get the most out of their learning experience. The cooperation of parents or student guardians is expected in this important matter.
- Attendance of digital students Attendance requires to be in classes from 8:20 AM-3:10 PM. Some students are absent to some classes throughout the day. This could be marked as skipping class.
- **Completion of classwork and homework (Digital Students)** Students must meet the required dates for completing work. Please, make sure students access their virtual classes, verify their platforms, and complete their assignments.
