








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
**Teacher retention** We need great teachers and we need them to stay!











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Bullying is out of control and they do little to nothing to actually handle it. Their zero tolerance policy is a joke. Bullying not handled has a huge mental health effect on children.

Help school and staff with student that have no respect for adults The student and parent need to know this is not acceptable in school and real world.








**Transportation and Pay** The bus transportation system is abysmal being chronically late and understaffed. The pay for transportation and teachers is ridiculously low.

Smaller classrooms Better attention to individual needs in classroom










