

What does it take to be accepted to a top 100 school?

- All schools will evaluate your admission based on:
- 1.Unweighted & weighted GPA
- 2. Rigor of your course load (3-6 AP classes minimum)
- 3.SAT/ACT scores
- 4.Leadership & life experience co-curriculars and paid experience
- 5.Project-oriented community service

Admission committees will also consider:

- 1.Strength of your letters of recommendation
- 2.Strength of your personal statement/essay



Holistic Review Process

First-Year admission is a holistic and selective process, and no single criterion guarantees admission. Rather, we consider a range of factors. Every application receives at least one read, with applicants in the middle 50th percent receiving additional holistic review(s). Subjective holistic scoring is combined with our objective analysis of the academic record to determine final decisions.



ACADEMICS

Academic performance, grade trend, rigor of curriculum, test scores.



ESSAY

Goals, experiences, personal stories of resilience that have significantly impacted the student's life.



RESUME

Extracurricular activities, community service, employment, special recognitions.





Admitted Student Profile






Fall 2022 Admitted Student Profile








High School at a Glance: Freshmen Year

Academics:

- AP World History or AP Human Geography
- Honors math, science, ELA
- Foreign language (you must have a minimum of 2 years of the same language, preferable 3-4 before you graduate for admission to 4-year colleges)
- Start your CTE pathway, ROTC, PE, AVID, and/or electives in the arts

Co-Curriculars:

• Explore clubs and sports that interest you. Don't be afraid to put yourself out there! Now is the time to try new things and learn more about what you like and don't like.

College Prep:

 Use Xello to start researching colleges, careers, and majors of interest



High School at a Glance: Sophomore Year



Academics:

- AP science, math, ELA, history, and/or elective classes tailor this to YOU!
- Foreign language if completing 3-4 years
- AP Seminar (class of 2025 and 2026 only)
- Continue with your CTE pathway, ROTC, AVID, and/or electives in the arts

• Co-Curriculars:

- Community service 100 hours minimum for high school career
- Start narrowing down and consistently engaging in activities you enjoy
- Take on leadership tasks when possible

• College Prep:

- ACT/SAT prep
- Tour colleges you are most interested in
- Continue to use Xello to research colleges, careers, and majors of interest

High School at a Glance: Junior Year

- Academics:
 - AP science, math, ELA, history, and/or elective classes tailor this to YOU!
 - Foreign language if completing 3-4 years
 - AP Seminar (class of 2023 only)
 - Continue with your CTE pathway, ROTC, AVID, and/or electives in the arts
- Co-Curriculars: This is the last full school year to show colleges what you're made of! Think about the differences you want to make in your community and work toward making it happen!
 - Wrap up community service hours and experiences you want on your college application
 - Step up into leadership roles in your clubs and sports
 - Part-time work
- College Prep:
 - ACT/SAT prep
 - Tour colleges you are most interested in
 - Continue to use Xello to research colleges, careers, and majors of interest –
 you should have a good idea of about 5 schools you're interested in and
 what their admission requirements are

High School at a Glance: Senior Year



- Academics: YOU STILL NEED A FULL, RIGOROUS COURSE LOAD YOUR SENIOR YEAR.
 - AP science, math, ELA, history, and/or elective classes tailor this to YOU!
 - AP Research
 - Foreign language if completing 3-4 years
- Co-Curriculars:
 - Continue what you started. *Enjoy your last year of high school student involvement* ②.
- College Prep:
 - Take ACT/SAT one last time in the fall
 - Submit all college applications by October
 - Complete FAFSA in October
 - Tour colleges you are most interested in to help you narrow down your list
 - Apply for scholarships (2/month minimum)

Tips for Success

- STAY. CONNECTED.
- Ask questions & keep lines of communication open
- Activities = QUALITY > QUANTITY
- Students -

• All -

- Don't go at it alone
- Get to know teachers and staff you connect with/enjoy
- Focus on your interests/strengths you cannot do it all. Your journey will look different than your peers.
- Family members -
 - Stay connected
 - Learn what to expect from your student and how to support them
 - Focus on the learning, not the "As"
