Academy Mission

Our mission is to ensure that our students learn business skills to prepare for the future, gain knowledge of money management by making better financial decisions, and practice real-life workplace applications.

Accounting I

Accounting provides students with an understanding of the accounting process and how it facilitates decision making by providing data and information to internal and external stakeholders. Students learn that accounting is an integral part of all business activities. They learn how to apply technology to accounting by creating formulas and inputting data into spreadsheets. Students also examine career opportunities and the professional certifications and designations earned by individuals in the accounting profession. This is the first course students take in the

Accounting II

This course emphasizes double-entry accounting; methods and principles of recording business transactions; the preparation of various documents used in recording income, expenses, acquisition of assets, incurrence of liabilities, and changes in equity; and the preparation of financial statements. The use of computers and appropriate software is required.

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Accounting III

In this course students review their knowledge of financial accounting. They become familiar with the roles and responsibilities of managers and managerial accountants. By comparing and contrasting financial and managerial accounting, students gain perspective on the course. Students then apply their understanding of management accounting to a potential job of their own.

Financial Intern

The financial internship course provides students with authentic learning experiences in which they demonstrate human relations, technical, communication, and career development skills through entry level employment in **Addition Financial School Branch**. Through hands-on project management, major tasks outlined in a training plan, mentors supervise student learning in specific skill attainment and professional development. Students earn high school credit and some students may receive financial compensation.
