CHOICE SCHOOLS - What's Next?

From November 2021 until the end of January 2022, thousands of parents exercised their right to apply to a Choice school which is the process of allowing families to choose the educational options that best fit their child's academic needs. These applications, submitted within the Choice window, will be part of a lottery process in early February leading to parental notifications being emailed by February 15, 2022. Parents will have until March 1, 2022 to accept the Choice offering.

There is Still Time to Find the Best School for Your Child

If you missed out on the first application window, the school district will open the late Choice application period on February 21, 2022. Visit www.osceolaschools.net/choice or www.myosceolachoice.school to find the best match for your child and apply. Let's take a moment to go over a few steps that will help you make an informed decision about the best fit for your child.

- Make a list of school expectations
- Along with your child compile a list of their interests
- Take the "Find Your Match" quiz by visiting https://www.myosceolachoice.school/quiz
- Call the schools suggested by the quiz and ask about magnet programs, extracurricular activities, clubs, etc.
- Request to schedule a school tour
- Talk with your child about their research experience
- Together decide on the best school
- Take the final step and apply

The School District of Osceola County is collaborating with Miami-Dade County Public Schools, The School District of Palm Beach County, and Broward County Public Schools on the implementation of a college access event highlighting Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

"No Limits On HBCUs" is a week initiative with participation from 20 HBCUs from across the country. This initiative will connect students and families from across our state with information about the outstanding post-secondary opportunities available at Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Each day, February 7 through February 11th, representatives from participating institutions will be available for one-hour information sessions.

Rodeo Day - Student Holiday

Every 3rd Friday in February, Osceola County students are given the day off from school to celebrate Rodeo Day. The first rodeo was held on July 4, 1944 and began as a program by the Silver Spurs Riding Club to raise funds for our country's military during World War II. Admission to the rodeo was the purchase of a war bond and over 1,000 people attended. Henry O. Partin, Osceola County Rancher, donated the rodeo grounds. The Silver Spurs Rodeo is recognized as the official state rodeo and is the largest rodeo east of the Mississippi River. This Osceola tradition is a big part of the culture in Kissimmee and St. Cloud and Osceola students are provided with a free admission to the rodeo where they can see cowboy and cowgirl sports such as bull riding, bronco busting, barrel racing, and calf roping.

The 148th Silver Spurs Rodeo weekend in Osceola begins on Friday, February 18th - student holiday (no school) and continues through Sunday, February 20th. Visit www.silverspursrodeo.com to learn about all the events taking place during rodeo weekend.
