This year on The Fourth of July, America turns 245 years young and cities across the United States will celebrate her independence.

Independence Day - the Birth of a Nation

On July 2, 1776, during the American Revolutionary War (1775-1783), representatives from 13 North American colonies of the kingdom of Great Britain voted to declare themselves independent from British rule and no longer pledge allegiance to the British Crown. Two days later, on July 4, 1776, Congress approved and signed the final text of the Declaration of Independence and announced to the world that the historic vote, which took place two days earlier gave birth to a new independent nation-the United States of America.

Why do We Celebrate?

Every year since July 4, 1776, Americans have celebrated the adoption of the Declaration of Independence and the ideas that all men are created equal, that they have certain inalienable rights including Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness, and that individuals have a civic duty to defend these rights for themselves and others in an independent nation. We, the people of the United States of America are the freest in the world and enjoy five protected freedoms. These are freedom of speech, religion, press, assembly and petition. We also enjoy certain civil rights. Among these are the right to vote, the right to a fair trial, the right to government services, **the right to a public education**, and the right to use public facilities.

Let's talk about the right to a public education. Although education may not be a "fundamental right" under the Constitution, the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment requires that when a state establishes a public school system, no child living in that state may be denied equal access to schooling. Today, students in the State of Florida have options available through School Choice. The Educational Choices and Innovation Department provides parents with information on the vast opportunities provided at all of Osceola's traditional public schools, magnet schools, charter schools and home education. Odyssey of the Mind has been the world's greatest creative problem-solving program since its inception in 1978. It teaches students how to think divergently by providing open-ended problems that appeal to a wide range of interests. Students learn how to identify challenges and to think creatively to solve those problems. The creative problem-solving process rewards thinking "beyond the box." These are the skills that they will need to compete for the jobs of the future.

Odyssey of the Mind participants are known as OMers after OMER, the raccoon mascot. Raccoons are known to be curious and resourceful. Odyssey of the Mind encourages young people to re-purpose, recycle, and reuse materials and continues to provide students with life lessons as it did in its beginning. While the world around us changes, Odyssey of the Mind continues to create challenging and fulfilling problems in a fun and friendly environment. It continues to believe that creativity can be taught and that education should be fun.

Typs for Summer Fun Stay Active and Beat the Heat

Kids need at least 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity each day. Help them stay active. Apply sunscreen and go outside and enjoy a game of sponge tag. The person who is "it" has a wet sponge to chase other players with. The first person tagged with the sponge becomes the next "it." Soak the sponge in clean, cold water after each round. Play this game on grass to make sure everyone stays safe. Afterwards, enjoy ice water to help you beat the heat. Add a little flavor to your water by putting chopped fruit or fresh herbs into an ice tray and freeze. Use the ice cubes to put in your water and you'll have fresh and flavorful tasting water.
