
Pid You Know?

Osceola Library Link (OLL)

Osceola County students enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 12 have access to the Osceola Library System as part of the new Osceola Library Link (OLL) Access Pass program. Students can check out and stream books, movies, music, do research and much more at any Osceola Library without an application or library card. Students are automatically enrolled! Simply use the letter "S" followed by the seven-digit student ID number (ex. S0123456) and enter the required PIN which is the student's birth year (ex. 2015) to use the OLL ACCESS Pass.
