Families in attendance gained a better understanding that the term "gifted" does not mean good or better but that it is a term that allows students to be identified for services that meet their unique learning needs. Gifted in a school setting means that a child has an advanced capacity to learn and apply what is learned in one or more subject areas, or in the performing or fine arts, when compared to other students their age or grade level.

The night also covered project-based learning and how it engages students in complex, real-world problem solving that is academically rigorous, empowers students as active learners as they use their knowledge and research skills to collaborate with their peers and find solutions to real-world problems based on projects that interest them.
