THE Z.E.T.A. FOUNDATION

The Zetas Excelling Through Action (Z.E.T.A.) Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit created in 2007 as the philanthropic arm of the Epsilon Epsilon Zeta chapter. The foundation’s exclusive purpose is to advance education by providing scholarships for qualified students, and conducting programming that promotes healthy lifestyles and service to the community.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS AND AWARD DISBURSEMENT

This scholarship is only available to **minority female**, graduating high school seniors from predominantly and surrounding Seminole Counties. “Minority” is defined as a member of a **traditionally underrepresented community** (i.e.: African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Pacific-Islander, etc.). The Scholarship will be awarded for the **Fall Semester** of the upcoming academic year. The scholarship awards may vary, with a maximum award of no more than \$1,100.00. The scholarship will be made payable directly to the college or university, to be applied toward tuition or other college expenses. All recipients will be notified by **April 25, 2020** via email or phone call, and will be recognized at the Blue and White Scholarship luncheon in **June 2020**. 1. Applications must be **postmarked** to the address below no later than **April 15, 2020**.

2. **Applicants must supply proof of acceptance and matriculation to a college or university such as a letter of acceptance.** A candidate for the scholarship may submit their application prior to receiving acceptance into a college or university (provided they have completed all other parts of the application). *However, a candidate’s application will not be considered complete until proof of matriculation is received by the scholarship committee, prior to the deadline..*
3. Applicants should include a list of extracurricular activities, social, civic and religious involvements.
4. Applicants must have at least **100 hours of documented community service**. Applicants should submit a **written summary (no more than two paragraphs) of their community service activities**, along with a **log of documented hours, signed and verified by their supervisor**.
5. Applicants must be full-time students in good standing with an **academic weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher**.
6. Applicants should have a **combined SAT score of at least 1000, or ACT score of at least 21**. Proof of score should be submitted with application.

7. A **professional or senior photograph** should be included with the application. No selfies or cell phone pictures will be accepted. However, proofs from senior photos will be accepted.

8. **Official High School transcripts and two letters of recommendation** must accompany the application. One must come from a **current teacher** and the other recommendation must come from **an organizational leader, an employer, or a spiritual leader**. Letters must be on **official letterhead, signed in ink by the recommender, and in sealed envelopes**. Transcripts must be **sealed**.

Applications will not be considered if not postmarked by the specified date, are incomplete, and/or are not signed by the student. All requirements must be met for consideration.
