

General Orders

1. To **take** charge of this post and all government Property in view
2. To **walk** my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert, and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
3. To **report** all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce
4. To **repeats** all calls from any post more distant from the guard house or quarter deck than my own.
5. To **quit** my post only when properly relieved.
6. To **receive, obey and pass** on to the sentry who relieves me, all orders from the Commanding Officer, Command Duty Officer, Officer of the Deck, and Officers and Petty Officers of the Watch only.
7. To **talk** to no one except in the line of duty.
8. To **give** the alarm in case of fire or disorder.
9. To **call** the Officer of the Deck in any case not covered by instructions.
10. To **salute** all Officers and all Colors and standards not cased.
11. To be **especially watchful** at night, and during the time of challenging, challenge all persons on or near my post and to allow no one to pass without proper authority.




