Viewing Grades on the Internet (PIV):

- Log on to: www.ncms.osceola.k12.fl.us
- Click "Continue" to the secure channel
- Username:
 - Student's 7 digit ID
 - ex: 0123456
- Password:
 - Month and day of student's birthday
 - ex: Oct 8 = 1008
 - ex: Jan 6 = 0106
- Select "Narcoossee Middle School"
- Click "Login"
- To see individual assignments:
 - Select class from menu on the left
 - Click "Student Assignments"
 - Click "Get Report"

Key: X=Excused, **Z**=Nothing submitted, and **0**=Submitted, but no credit awarded

Note: Grades in the current quarter are <u>NOT</u> final grades, but they do average into the yearly and semester grades.

- Monitor and limit TV and video game time
- Be available
- Check the Parent Internet Viewer for zeroes and Zs

Provide Guidance

- Help your child get organized
- Encourage good study habits
- Talk about the assignments
- Watch for frustration
- Give praise

Talk with Teachers

- Communicate regularly
- Tell the teachers about your concerns proactively
