Mr. Mel Welch called the meeting to order.

Introductions

Ms. Graber welcomed the appointment of Brian Horton, President and General Manager, CEO of Kissimmee Utility Authority, to the Business Advisory Board. The School Board approved Mr. Horton's appointment on July 30th.

Mr. Lacerte announced that with the appointment of another member from KUA, he felt it was time for him to step down. The members and staff thanked him for his many years of service on the BAB and accepted his resignation.

• Superintendent Update

Dr. Pace welcomed the board members to NeoCity Academy. Mr. Welch applauded Superintendent Pace for a smooth start of school. The superintendent shared that the District was able to eliminate 40 bus routes from the previous year and stated that while there are always challenges during the first week of school, overall everything went very smoothly.

The school district has requested involvement in the County's pre-preplanning development committee meetings. The district is working on capacity reports to provide the County with accurate, transparent numbers. The superintendent invited the BAB members to an Intergovernmental Meeting scheduled for September 10th at 3pm at 817 Bill Beck Blvd.

Ms. Graber shared that the final budget hearing will be held on September 10th at 5:30pm, and the district budget and millage rates will be approved at that time. She reminded everyone that this year's per student funding increase was just over 1.5%, excluding the Best & Brightest bonus program. Current student projections appear to be slightly higher than the 1,800 estimated; however, enrollment is down for traditional schools, up for charter schools and there are currently 260 students enrolled in private schools through the new Family Empowerment Scholarship Voucher Program.

Definitions

<u>COFTE</u>

• Is the unit of measurement (minutes in a seat) employed by the State of Florida to count PK-12 public school student enrollment for the purposes of funding education. COFTE does not include: Traditional Charter Schools, Hospital/Homebound, McKay Scholarships, DJJ students, Florida Virtual students, etc.

Warm Body

• Is the number of students attending a school regardless of the time spent in a seat.

Student Station

• Is the number of students that can be housed in the permanent portion of a school, as determined by the design criteria defined in the State Requirements for Educational Facilities.

Student Capacity

• Is the number of students who may be housed in a facility at any given time based on a utilization percentage of the total number of existing satisfactory student stations.

Functional Capacity

• The number of students that can be housed in the permanent portion of a school as determined by the actual usage of the school.

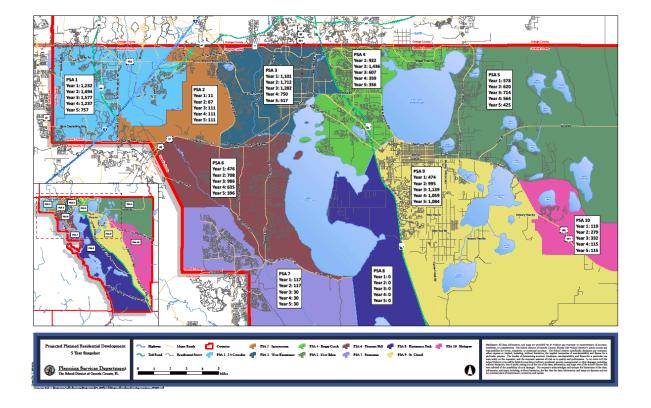

 A school will not open without a "minimum school guarantee." In other words, a minimum number of students are required to generate enough FTE for the school to be sustainable.



- The School Board does not oppose new residential development but it does want to ensure that the impacts are mitigated to provide student capacity. The revenue sources are available for new construction to create the necessary student capacity. However, a collaborative effort by Osceola County and the municipalities is required in securing land for future schools.
- We look forward to continuing our partnerships with the County and municipalities as we work together to advance our community.

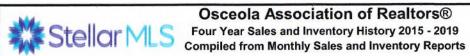
