- (e) School districts are required to pay for instructional materials used for the instruction of public high school students who are earning credit tow

(f) 80 percent of each district's Teacher Salary Increase Allocation, pursuant to section 1011.62, F.S., is for school districts and charter schools to provide a minimum base salary of \$47,500 or the maximum amount achievable for full-time classroom teachers as defined in s. 1012.01(2)(a), F.S., including pre-kindergarten teachers funded through the FEFP but not including substitute teachers. The remaining 20 percent of the allocation, plus any remaining funds from the district's share of the 80 percent allocation, shall be used by the school districts as specified in s. 1011.62, F.S., to provide salary increases to full-time classroom teachers that did not receive an increase, full-time classroom teachers who received an increase of less than 2 percent, or other instructional personnel.

This allocation was calculated in the 2020-21 FEFP Second Calculation and will not be recalculated throughout the year. Charter schools should contact their sponsoring school district to determine the school's allocation amount.
