COMMUNITY SERVICE is defined as identifying a social issue in the community. This requires students to look beyond themselves and reach out to an issue faced by our society today (i.e. poverty, abuse, elderly rights, etc.). These hours will meet the requirement for the Bright Futures scholarships.

VOLUNTEER SERVICE is defined as assisting where needed and does not necessarily address a social issue. Although these hours are not recorded on the transcript, students can keep a log of these activities for use when applying for college, job applications, awards and scholarships other than the Bright Futures.

Per The state of Florida, eligibility for a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship award requires that students meet minimum grade point averages (GPA), test scores (SAT or ACT), and complete certain courses. For specific requirements concerning GPA, test scores and courses needed, please ese the Florida Bright Futures Website and/or contact your high school counselor. Scholarship eligibility also requires that students complete volunteer work service as approved by the local school district for the Florida Bright Futures program. Students must be a high school student, enrolled in grades 9-12. (NOTE: Summer before 9th grade is acceptable once the student has been promoted to the 9th grade and IF the Bright Futures Community Service Proposal Form has been approved.)

The required community service work hours for the Bright Futures Scholarships are as follows:

- Florida Academic Scholarship 100 hours
- Florida Medallion Scholarship 75 hours
- Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship 30 hours
- Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholarship 30 hours

Steps to Document the Bright Futures Community Service Hours

- 1. Contact the agency of organization to discuss the social or civic issue, or professional area of interest and develop a plan of action.
- 2. Complete the Bright Futures Community Service Proposal Plan.
- 3. Submit the Bright Futures Community Service Proposal Plan to the High School Counselor for approval.
- 4. Log the service hours on the Bright Futures Community Service Log Form. The agency of organization contact person or supervisor must sign this form.
- 5. Submit the completed Bright Futures Community Service Log Form along with the Bright Futures Community Service Reflection Form to the High School Counselor.
- 6. The community service work hours will be documented on the student's official high school transcript and all documentation will be filed by the High School Community Service Designee.
- 7. It is recommended that students deep copies of all completed Community Service Log and Reflection Forms for their own records. Students should also update their Naviance resume to reflect service hours.
- 8. All community service documentation (Proposals, Log Forms, and Reflection Forms) must be completed, signed, and submitted PRIOR to graduation.
