- (e) School districts are required to pay for instructional materials used for the instruction of public high school students who are earning credit toward high s (f) 80 percent of each district's Teacher Salary Increase Allocation, pursuant to section 1011.62, F.S., is for school districts and charter schools to provide a minimum base salary of \$47,500 or the maximum amount achievable for full-time classroom teachers as defined in s. 1012.01(2)(a), F.S., including pre-kindergarten teachers funded through the FEFP but not including substitute teachers.
