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Osceola Schools Earn State Award For Exemplary Volunteer Programs Which Promote Parent and Community Involvement In Education

The Osceola School District has 56 schools that have qualified for the Golden School Award given by the Florida Department of Education in recognition of exemplary volunteer programs which promote parent and community involvement in education. To qualify for the Golden School Award, a school's total number of volunteer service hours must equal their student enrollment. The following Osceola schools have earned the 2019-2020 Golden School Award:
